Evaluation of Internal Transfers Between the Institution's Programs

1) Students' transfer applications are accepted, starting with the most successful applicants within the limits of the available quotas.

2) For evaluating transfer applications in undergraduate programs, compatibility of the concerned programs and similar criteria are taken into account, and an evaluation score is calculated using the applicant's YKS placement score in the score type of the program to be transferred to and their grade point average on the 100-point scale. Grades on the 4-point scale are converted into the 100-point scale based on the CoHE's conversion table. The calculation formula is as follows: Evaluation Score = (Applicant's YKS placement score / Program's base score) x 70 + (Applicant's Grade Point Average / 100) x 30. The applicants are ranked based on their evaluation scores. In case of a tie, the number of successfully passed courses is taken into account.

3) Decisions of acceptance or rejection are finalized with the relevant department's proposal and the relevant board's approval. Each faculty sends a list of accepted applicants to Student Affairs.

Evaluation of National Inter-Institutional Lateral Transfers

1) Students' transfer applications are accepted, starting with the most successful applicants within the limits of the available quotas.

2) Decisions of acceptance or rejection are finalized with the relevant department's proposal and the relevant board's approval. Each faculty sends a list of accepted applicants to Student Affairs in writing.

3) For evaluating transfer applications in undergraduate programs, compatibility of the concerned programs and similar criteria are taken into account, and an evaluation score is calculated using the applicant's YKS placement score in the score type of the program to be transferred to and their grade point average on the 100-point scale. Grades on the 4-point scale are converted into the 100-point scale based on the CoHE's conversion table. The calculation formula is as follows: Evaluation Score = (Applicant's YKS placement score / Program's base score) x 70 + (Applicant's Grade Point Average / 100) x 30. The applicants are ranked based on their evaluation scores. In case of a tie, the number of successfully passed courses is taken into account.

Evaluation of Lateral Transfers with Central Placement Scores

1) If there are more applicants than the available quota, applicants with higher YKS placement scores are accepted for transfer until the quota is full.

Evaluation of Lateral Transfers from Higher Education Institutions Abroad

1) The compatibility of the programs and similar criteria are taken into account, and an evaluation score is calculated using the applicant's YKS placement score in the score type of the program to be transferred to or the SAT composite score and their grade point average on the 100-point scale. Grades on the 4-point scale are converted into the 100-point scale based on the CoHE's conversion table. The calculation formula using the YKS score is as follows: Evaluation Score = (Applicant's YKS placement score / Program's base score) x 70 + (Applicant's Grade Point Average / 100) x 30. The calculation formula using the SAT score is as follows: Evaluation Score = (Applicant's SAT composite score / Program's base composite score requirement for SAT) x 70 + (Applicant's Grade Point Average / 100) x 30. The

applicants are ranked based on their evaluation scores. In case of a tie, the number of successfully passed courses is taken into account.

Evaluation of Lateral Transfers Requested by AGU's International Students

1) An evaluation score is calculated using the applicant's SAT composite score and grade point average on the 100-point scale. Grades on the 4-point scale are converted into the 100-point scale based on the CoHE's conversion table. The calculation formula is as follows: Evaluation Score = (Applicant's SAT composite score / Program's base composite score requirement for SAT) x 70 + (Applicant's Grade Point Average / 100) x 30. The applicants are ranked based on their evaluation scores. In case of a tie, the number of successfully passed courses is taken into account.
